

### **Community Fridge**

March 29, 2021

Dear parishioners and visitors,

You will notice a shed-like structure going up on our parking lot. Some of you may already know its purpose, but for those who do not, here is the information. With the consent of the Pastoral and Finance Councils, we have agreed to allow the Cathedral Community Association to open a "Community Fridge" on our premises. A similar one has been in operation for some time on Dewdney Ave., and is filling an important need in that area. The concept has become widespread in many cities in North America.

Rob Chapple and other members of our Grounds and Building Committee have been working closely with the Executive of the association on the construction plans of the "Fridge", ensuring its safety and the least inconvenience to us.

Functioning on volunteers' energy and generosity, the structure will provide food and a few essential commodities to those in need in our neighbourhood. It will house a freezer, fridge, and pantry (and a heater for the winter months). Our parish will have no responsibility for its upkeep other than providing a site and an electrical outlet. Volunteer teams from the community association will make sure it is kept clean and well-stocked.

It will depend on people in our out-lying neighbourhood (including those of us in the parish) to contribute food and non-perishable items (diapers, toilet paper, toothpaste, etc.). As soon as the structure is ready to open, we will provide you with information regarding what will be needed and acceptable.

This is a good opportunity for us to put into action our commitment to social justice, to respond to the call to help those less fortunate than we are.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to send them to us or to any member of the Pastoral and Finance Councils.

Archdiocese of Regina created Way of the Cross -Through the Voice of Victims Prayed in St. Edmund of Canterbury, England - Holy Week has many symbols, with the cross being one of the most powerful. Victims of clergy sexual abuse carry heavy crosses. In 2017, a group of victims and non-victims from inside and outside the church gathered and entered into a challenging dialogue resulting in a unique work entitled The Way of the Cross-Through the Voice of the Victims. It has been shared and prayed in parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Regina since early 2018 and was done so on a regular basis. Covid has of course forced us all to find other ways to reach out since in person interaction has been drastically restricted. Today, I want to draw your attention to a recorded live stream event that occurred on Friday, March 26 in the parish of St. Edmund of Canterbury Catholic Church in the Archdiocese of Southwark in England. A day of prayer was held for victims/survivors of sexual abuse, using The Way of the Cross-Through the Voice of Victims. The ability to reach victims on the other side of the ocean by words written here is really a truly amazing accomplishment achieved by working together. I invite you during this Holy Week to take the time to watch the recorded event and enter into the pain of the crucifixion as experienced in the lives of many victims.
