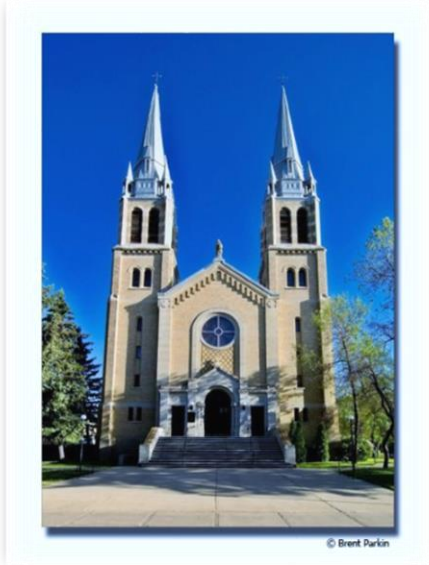

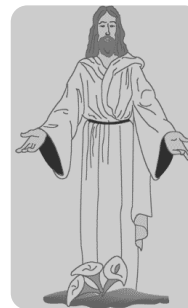

Dear parishioners and visitors,

Many acknowledge that we are blessed in having four seasons in the year, although some of us remember when it was said that Saskatchewan only had two seasons: Winter and July! Hard to believe that there are many countries where weather throughout the year simply fluctuates from "coolish" to warm to very hot. The changing seasons certainly give us a chance to marvel at Nature's ever-renewing face: the seemingly-magical emergence of tiny buds on the trees in late May, the bounty of flowers and fresh vegetables in our gardens from June to September, the gorgeous fiery Fall colours, and the awe-inspiring hoar-frosts to make up for the four months of snow and bitter cold!

But yes, thank God for Summer!

By mid-July, the Steering Committee for the Cathedral Renewal Project expects to have signed an agreement with the construction company chosen among a number of bids. Work on the first phase of renovations to the Cathedral will begin by the end of July. It is being funded from donations received so far to the Rebuilding Our Church Campaign and expresses our gratitude to the Archdiocese and the campaign donors.

We are forewarning you that the project going forward will mean some disruption in the next ten months or so.

The work at the south end of the building should not change anything for most of us, as only a handful of people use the stairway and washroom in that area. In the north end, there will be the construction of a new (larger and more accessible) elevator and likewise washroom. That means disruption at the entrance to the church and in the front part of the basement as well, where another washroom will be built. The existing elevator and washrooms in the foyer will no longer be functional during the construction period. However, the ramp on the west side of the building will allow easy access into the church for those with mobility issues. As well, there is a newly renovated and accessible washroom in the Sacristy, and there are other existing washrooms in the basement. The Ushers at the various Sunday Masses will be available to give help and guidance to those needing such.

So bear with us. The end result will be worth the disruption!

The Archdiocesan office is giving individual parishes the prerogative to return to the distribution of the Holy Eucharist under the two species. In our parish, we have decided to remain cautious and will continue with our practice of distributing only the Host unless there is a demand from the parishioners.

As always, here is the information to keep you abreast of our financial situation: the offertory donations for the month of **April were \$35,894 and for May, \$25,751**. The prorated year-to-date budget is \$158,332 and the actual year-to-date collection is \$135,833. The **revenue shortfall to date is \$12,499**. We remind you that e-transfer is an efficient and easy method of making donations. Thank you for your continuing support of our parish; your generosity keeps our doors open!

A reminder: throughout the months of July and August, the parish office will be open only between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

In the name of all in the Parish and Finance Councils, we wish you and your families a healthy, relaxing summer, one marked with joyous moments!

A Word About Trauma...

Trauma and associated words are being used more now than ever. Do we know the origins of these words? Are their meanings different now than when they were first used? Each week we will explore a trauma-associated word's origins, meanings and evolution.

Coping coping

Coping is a dynamic process that involves both cognitive and behavioural changes to manage stress. There are two major categories of coping: problem-focused and emotion-focused coping. Old English cope dress in cope and moving to mid 16th century. Coping refers to conscious strategies used to reduce unpleasant emotions. Coping strategies can be cognitions or behaviours and can be individual or social. The fact of dealing successfully with problems or difficult situations: a coping mechanism/strategy, coping skills/abilities.

itwewin Corner (itwewin is the Cree word which means 'the word' or 'as it is said...') Fr. John Weckend, Archdiocese of Regina Truth and Reconciliation Healing Committee.

Did you know... Star Blanket Cree Nation is located 18 kms northeast of Balcarres with a population of approximately 725 members. The nation is named after Chief Acahkoa ka-otakohpit (One who has stars for a blanket). Chief Wah-pi-moos-toosis (White Calf), a leader of the Calling River Cree signed Treaty 4 in 1874. In October 2022, globalnews.ca/news/9409684/next-steps-star-blanket-cree-nation-anomalies-residential-school/ between ages 4 and 6 was found at the site of Lebret Indian Residential School. The Saskatchewan Coroner's Office confirmed that it aged at about 125 years old dating back to 1898, physical proof of an unmarked grave. Indigenous survivors of residential schools have always said that many children died for nefarious reasons at these institutions. Many children did not return home. The Nation continues its search for unmarked children's graves at the site.

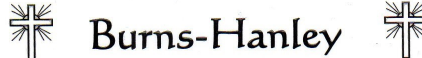
