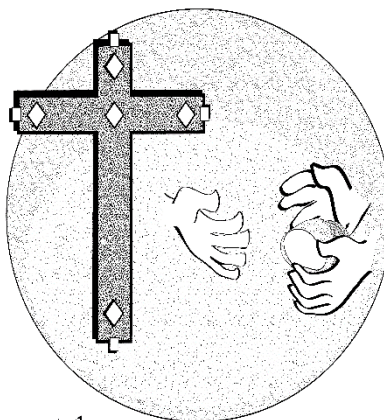



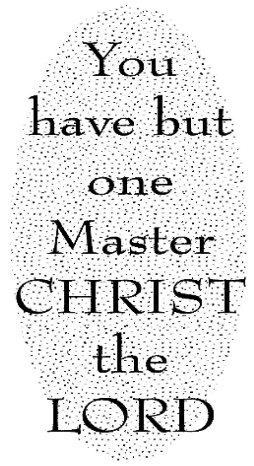

Dear fellow-parishioners & visitors,

As you know, Fr. Dan is away on a delayed, well-earned holiday and spiritual retreat. He was unable to take time off during the summer, which was a busy time for weddings and baptisms. He returns on November 23.

I am sure you will agree that it is exciting to see the start of renovations in our beautiful cathedral. This is just the beginning, for there is much to do in the way of necessary repairs, which are neither cosmetic nor simple maintenance. Our building is more than a century old, and much fundamental work is needed to preserve it for future generations.

We will try to keep the disruptions to a minimum, and will trust in your patience and good humour as the project progresses. The washrooms in the church's entrance and the elevator will no longer be available, but there are washrooms in the basement and behind the Sacristy for your use. The ramp on the west side of the church will help for accessibility issues. Please do not hesitate to ask for assistance from the ushers. There will be no interruptions to our Masses and other services; the basement will continue to be available for events. We will continue to notify you with information pertinent to your comfort and support.

The *Oktoberfest* on October 14 was a big success as both a fund-raiser and as a community gathering! There were 180 attendees, almost as many as were present at the event in pre-Pandemic time; the buffet was scrumptious and the live music and dancing great fun. Tim and Krista LaBelle and their team put in many hours organizing and planning, and their work paid off. Matt Dipple was a most engaging emcee, and with his wit managed various ploys to get people to dig deep into their pockets to add to the fund. The **total net of their efforts: \$4884.40!!** That figure includes ticket sales (after paying the Caterers), the silent auction, and the result of Matt's charm.....

Thank you again to the team, and to those who attended the event. The fund-raiser will be a boon to our building's maintenance budget.

The first of the planned "Candlelight Concerts" took place last Friday, October 27. There had been much anticipation and curiosity among many music-lovers in the city, and that resulted in a full house: there were 580 tickets sold! The light from 2300 (!!) LED candles in the front of the church created a magical atmosphere. Those who were at the concert commented on the superb programme, and on the palpable respect of the audience in being in the cathedral. There were obviously many who had never been in this heritage building. They were heard to exclaim at the beautiful stained-glass windows and the architecture of the church. Our parish should be proud to be part of this new cultural endeavour in Regina.

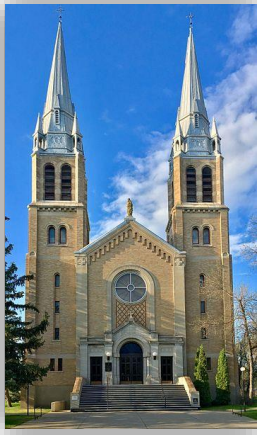
A "**scam alert**" has been sent out by **the Archdiocesan office**, regarding callers pretending to be priests or office staff and asking for financial help. The e-mail addresses they use can look deceiving. The office has this message for us: "At no time will our priests, deacons, religious or diocesan staff contact you seeking Google Play Cards, iTunes cards or any other form of personal financial assistance."

And for the monthly financial picture: your donations in **September** amounted to **\$29,891**; the annual **prorated budget to date is \$285,000**, the **actual collection \$255,040**. The **shortfall** in revenue to date is **\$29,900**, which is worrisome, but we continue to be hopeful that we can have a balanced budget by the end of the year. Fr. Dan and the Parish and Finance Councils thank you for your continuing generosity.

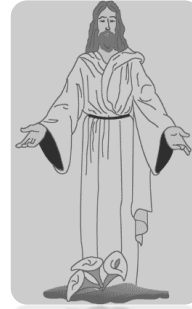

You will notice the email address may have some correct info, though in an unfamiliar form with additional characters, numbers or periods. Most will ask you to contact them or send information.

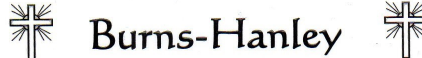
