





To all of the faithful of the Archdiocese of Regina

Dear friends in Christ,

Pope Francis has called the whole church to a process of consultation that will culminate in the Synod of Bishops in October 2023. The synodal path will begin next week at the Vatican, in the presence of the Pope Francis with a time for encounter and reflection, followed by a moment of prayer and the celebration of the Eucharist. This synodal path will then continue in each diocese around the world.



The Church in the Archdiocese of Regina will launch our diocesan phase on **Sunday, October 17 at 3 pm** with a special diocesan celebration of the Eucharist at Holy Rosary Cathedral. All are invited and encouraged to participate. I particularly encourage you to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit upon our reflections whether in person at this celebration or via the livestream.

The theme for the upcoming synod is in fact “synodality”, which means “walking together.” The Church is called together by the Holy Spirit and formed into the body of Christ. We are bound together by baptism in communion with one another and with Christ. Synodality is the way of life and work of the Church, the People of God, which reveals and gives substance to her being as communion when all her members gather and dialogue, journey together, and take an active part in her evangelizing mission.

Over the coming months, I am asking that every community, parish, school, ministry, and lay association plan some time to reflect on the ways that we “walk together” as a local church. Specifically, we want you to reflect on these two questions:

- How is this ‘walking together’ happening today in your local parish/community?
- What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our ‘walking together’?

I have appointed a team to coordinate our diocesan consultation. You will hear directly from the team frequently over the next months. This consultation is very important for the life of our church in the Archdiocese, in Canada, and throughout the world. Your participation is deeply desired.

Come Holy Spirit! Renew us in your love.

To pastors, parish life coordinators, parish council and deanery chairpersons, school boards, lay associations, and religious orders.

Hello friends,

Archbishop Don Bolen has already sent you the attached letter inviting you to join in the upcoming Diocesan Consultation on Synodality, which begins on **Sunday, October 17, 2021** with a special diocesan celebration of the Eucharist at Holy Rosary Cathedral at 3pm. We encourage you all to attend and to bring representatives from your parish or community. This Mass will be livestreamed for those unable to attend in person.



Our diocesan consultation is the first step in a 2-year process of widespread consultation throughout the whole church. Pope Francis has invited us to reflect on the ways that we experience the bonds of communion in our local churches and how we might strengthen these bonds. You will hear the word “synodality” used frequently throughout this process. We have had other synods over the past 50 years since the Second Vatican Council. Some, such as the recent synods on the Family (2014 and 2015), on Young People (2018), or on the Amazon (2019) have been particularly important occasions for the life of the church.

The theme of this coming synod is the experience of “synodality” itself. Synod is a word from the Greek syn-odos, literally meaning “with” and “path”, to walk along the path together. Consider the biblical passage of the disciples on the road to Emmaus, where Cleopas and his companion are joined by the resurrected Jesus, who walks with them and explains the scriptures to them. The passage ends with a meal in which they finally recognize him in the breaking of the bread. Synodality is about walking together in a shared search for Christ in scripture, prayer, and common life.

Pope Francis has asked that reflection begin around the world to feed insight into the reflections in national and regional consultations before the Synod of Bishops meets in October 2023. Our diocesan consultation concludes in early February 2022 with a report from the Archdiocese that will be sent to the national consultation and will be published locally. This process will also be the basis of new pastoral priorities for the Archdiocese.

In this diocesan phase, every community, deanery, parish, school, ministry, religious order, and lay association is asked to plan some time to reflect on the ways that we “walk together” as a local church. Specifically, we want you to reflect on these two questions:

- How is this ‘walking together’ happening today in your local parish/community?
- What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our ‘walking together’?

We will be preparing resources to assist in this consultation. These will be distributed to you shortly. In the interim, we ask that you set aside a time within your fall agenda to engage in this consultation process. We expect this to require a special meeting of two or more hours.

The Archdiocesan Synod Team will be preparing workshops at the deanery level to introduce the concept of synod and to train local coordinators to facilitate the consultation in your specific communities. We expect to hold these workshops during the last weeks of October.

We will also be preparing resources to support individual Catholics in conversations with family and friends who have become distanced from the church. We wish this to be a welcoming and non-judgemental invitation to share their experiences with us so that we might better respond to the pastoral needs of our whole community.

Finally, we will be engaging in a conversation with our ecumenical and interfaith partners. From our ecumenical partners we hope to learn more about the ways that synodality is expressed in their community and whether there are elements of their community life that might be a gift to us as we seek to become more synodal. From our interfaith partners, we seek to find ways that we might work together for the common good.

The idea of spiritual adoption of priests, where a woman adopts a certain priest as her spiritual "son" for whom she promises to pray, is not a new one; however, it was reserved only for nuns. In 2007, the Congregation of the Clergy, with the approval of Pope Benedict XVI, invited lay women to adopt priests as their spiritual sons, and to pray for them constantly, particularly before the Blessed Sacrament. In this Spiritual Motherhood of Priests, we try to imitate our Blessed Mother Mary, the first Mother of Priests, in her humility and sacrifice. We adopt priests as our sons with the commitments of Eucharistic Adoration, daily prayers, and sacrifices to help our priest-sons give themselves to God more perfectly in being shepherds of their flocks, leading us all to heaven with them.
