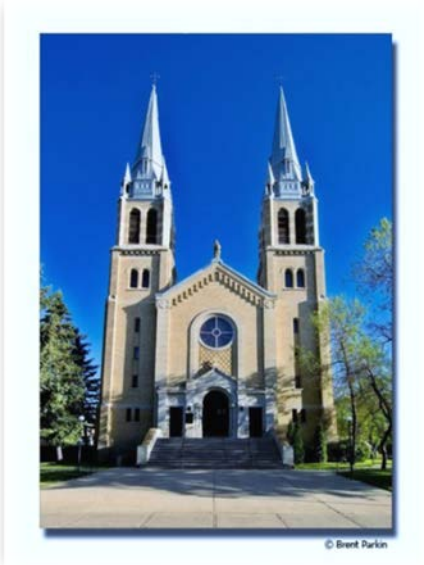

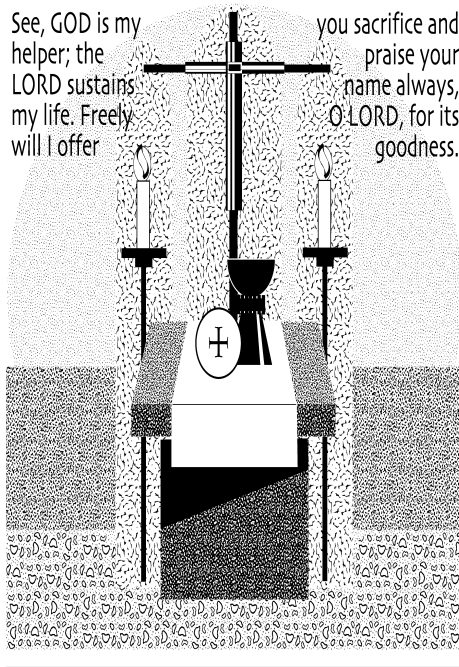

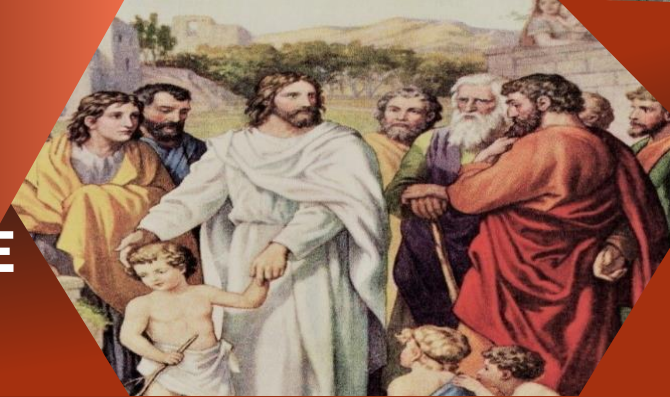

Mandatory Masking in Parishes

As the COVID infection rate rises in Saskatchewan, the Government announced new public health orders. You can find all of these details on the government website at [Public Health Measures](#)

The details affecting places of worship are as follows:

Mandatory mask order:

Effective, Friday, September 17, masks must be worn in every indoor public space. This means that places of worship will need to ensure that all attending are wearing masks.

Masking exemptions can be found on the Public Health Order. The following would apply in places of worship:

4(c)(i) Individuals aged two and under;

4(c)(ii) Individuals aged three to twelve who are not reasonably able to wear a face covering;

4(c)(iii) Subject to subsection (g), individuals who, in the determination of a health professional, are unable to wear a face covering due to a particular medical condition and have received written confirmation of same in accordance with subsection (f);

4(c)(iv) Individuals who, due to cognitive impairment, an intellectual disability, or a severe mental health condition, are unable to understand the requirement;

4(c)(vi) Individuals who are leading a service, ceremony, or other public event while speaking from a podium, lectern, platform, stage, desk or other standing or seating area dedicated to speaking, but only when the individual can maintain a distance of three metres from other individuals;

4(c)(vii) Individuals playing a woodwind, brass, or other instrument operated by breath, but only if they can maintain a distance of three metres from other individuals, as measured from the mouth or opening/bell end of the instrument, whichever is closest, to another individual while playing;

Individuals may remove their mask briefly in order to consume the eucharist.

Proof of vaccination:

Places of worship are exempt from the proof of vaccination policy.

In summary:

Please continue to be cautious and prudent. Encourage regular hand sanitizing. Physical distancing is not required but is encouraged. Physical touching (shaking hands, hugging, etc...) is discouraged. There are no indications yet whether there will be limits on serving food or beverages in places of worship.

Dear parishioners and visitors,

We hope this finds you and your loved ones in good health, and enjoying the last days of summer. It is truly heart-warming to see so many in attendance at Sunday Mass, glad to be able to visit with one another in our community.

The flip side to our relief that life seems to have returned to some kind of normalcy is the predicted 4th wave of the pandemic with its new variant and the rise of cases in our province. And as expected, some restrictions are back. **We now must keep our masks on in church, and at gatherings in the auditorium. Uncomfortable though it may be, we have to think not just of ourselves but of others.**

On Saturday, September 18, the Regina Symphony Orchestra opens its 2021-2022 season with a concert of Chamber music at Holy Rosary Cathedral. The next event at our venue will be on **October 1 and 2, a concert featuring our parish's very own Jonathan Craig-Penner on the cello.** His family being long-time parishioners, we watched Jonathan growing up, so to speak; we remember him as an altar server, as an Organ Scholar at the cathedral and eventually a frequent organist at our Masses.

On October 9, the concert at the cathedral is the launch of the newly-created Baroque series, designed specifically to show-case the cathedral's acoustics. For tickets and more information about its season, please look up reginasymphony.com, send an e-mail to info@reginasymphony.com, or call (306) 586 -9555. The symphony orchestra will be performing 10 concerts in the cathedral, from September to April. Opening our doors to the RSO has made us an integral part of the city's cultural life, making our church known to so many who had never been inside it. We received many compliments last year about its beautiful architecture and awe-inspiring acoustics

Be aware that masks and proof of vaccinations are required by the RSO for attendance at its concerts, an essential policy at the moment, to protect both patrons and musicians.

Sacramental preparations will resume the first week in October, starting with Reconciliation, and in January 2022, with First Holy Communion and Confirmation. RCIA instruction will also be offered in the Fall.

We welcome to our parish and to our Sunday Mass ministry Rev. Scott Lewis, S.J. Fr. Lewis is a Scripture scholar, and was a professor at Regis College in Toronto until his recent retirement. He will be a sessional lecturer in Catholic Studies at Campion College.

On September 15, our new Music Director, Evanne Wilhelm, gathered cantors, organists, and singers for an evening of "music appreciation", and to re-start choral music at the 11:00 Mass, which had been brought to a halt because of the pandemic. She presented her dynamic vision of music ministry at the cathedral and her plans for the coming liturgical year. The first hurdle is recruiting singers for the choir (especially for the tenor and bass sections).

The Community Fridge has been open for a number of months, and is serving a need in our neighbourhood. There is constant need of donations of food (fresh, canned, frozen – but no leftovers or home-made dishes), personal care products, baby food, juice, bread and milk. Do keep this community initiative in mind.

Our Building and Grounds committee have been quite busy installing new bright lights on the outside of the cathedral; the lights are left on all night as a safety measure. Work continues on the windows in the towers,

as well as on drainage issues in the parking lot. The east staircase is now completed; not only is its design kind to those with mobility issues, it is also quite aesthetic.

Once again, thanks to your continuing generosity, and despite a shortfall of \$48, 260 to date, we are able to "keep the lights on" in the cathedral. Total parish revenue for September, including \$26,257 in offertory collection and wage subsidy from the gov't (\$3,435), amounted to \$36,075. Year to date receipts is \$225,071 (prorated budget to date is \$273,333).

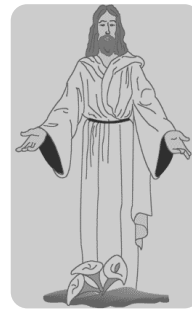

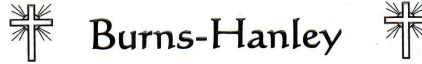
