



FLASH FLOOD FUNDRAISER UPDATE January 8, 2025

In the fall of 2024, the Philippine community from which Fr. Dan comes (Municipality of Gainza, Province of Camarines Sur) experienced a devastating flood. In response to the devastation, after consultation with Social Justice and some parish council members, Holy Rosary Cathedral held a flash flood fundraiser, raising \$14,098.47.

136 blackboards for 68 classrooms, will cost \$14,927.00. The cost per blackboard is P4,500.00 (equivalent to 110.00 CDN). So, our parish will be paying for a large portion of the 136 blackboards. The School District Supervisor, Mrs. E. Muniz, is our contact, telling us blackboard replacement would be essential for the classrooms in one high school and six elementary schools. Fr. Dan's sister, a teacher in the district, is in conversation with a supplier in the Philippines to procure the blackboards.

We all wish dollars could stretch to provide funds for building materials for poor people who need to rebuild their homes. The funds Holy Rosary Cathedral parishioners raised will be almost enough for the blackboards.

Father Dan is travelling to the district at the end of January. When he returns, he will have a report, photos and invoices.


